THE HERTFORDSHIRE (ELEANOR CROSS ROAD, ELEANOR SQUARE, HIGH STREET AND PARK LANE, WALTHAM CROSS) (PEDESTRIAN ZONE) ORDER 2024

The Hertfordshire County Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2 and 3 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said Act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as “the Act of 1984”), and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:-`

1. (a) This Order may be cited as “The Hertfordshire (Eleanor Cross Road, Eleanor Square, High Street and Park Lane, Waltham Cross) (Pedestrian Zone) Order 2024” shall come into effect on Friday 5 December 2025.
- (b) The plans numbered **B00724 PZ A-1, A2, A-3** and **B00724 PZ Mod** inclusive of the keys therein are incorporated into this Order and its Schedule.
2. **Interpretation**
In this Order –
 - (a) “civil enforcement officer” has the meaning as given in the Traffic Management Act.
 - (b) “County Council” means Hertfordshire County Council.
 - (c) “Council” means Broxbourne Borough Council and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agent appointed by and acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of any function under the provisions of this Order;
 - (d) “hand-held device”, means a portable computing device which can transmit data to and receive data from the electronic parking permits management system for the purposes of verifying if valid permits have been granted or issued in respect of vehicles left in any parking place specified in the map-based schedule;
 - (e) ‘motor vehicle’ shall have the meaning as given in Section 136(1) Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.
 - (f) ‘pedal cycle’ shall have the meaning as given in The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 – Part 2, Schedule 1.
 - (g) “Pedestrian Zone” means those lengths of Eleanor Cross Road, Eleanor Square, High Street and Park Lane, Waltham Cross as specified on plans **B00724 PZ A-1, A2, A-3** and **B00724 PZ Mod** and in the keys therein, which is incorporated into this Order.
 - (h) “permit holder” shall have the meaning as any person who is the holder of a valid permit issued by the Council which, with the agreement of the County Council, entitles a motor vehicle being used by the holder to enter the Pedestrian Zone during restricted hours.
 - (i) "relevant position" means a vehicle displays a permit in the relevant position if:
 - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the permit is exhibited thereon so that it is legible from outside the vehicle; or

- (ii) in the case of vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the permit is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that it is legible from outside the vehicle.
 - (j) “restricted hours” shall have the meaning as shown and specified on plans **B00724 PZ A-1, A2, A-3** and **B00724 PZ Mod** and the keys therein.
 - (k) “universal service provider”, “provision of a universal postal Service” and “postal packet” shall bear the same meanings as in Section 65 of the Postal Services Act 2011.
 - (l) “valid permit” shall have the meaning as a permit issued by the Council in a form prescribed by the Council, which, with the agreement of the County Council, entitles a motor vehicle being used by a permit holder to enter the Pedestrian Zone during restricted hours.
3. Save as provided in Article 4 to this Order no person shall cause any motor vehicle to enter or be in the pedestrian zone as defined within Article 2(c) during the restricted hours.
4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order applies in relation to –
- (a) a motor vehicle being used by a permit holder on which there is either displayed in the relevant position a valid permit or in respect of which there is an indication via a hand-held device that there has been granted a valid permit.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for Fire and Rescue, Ambulance or Police purposes.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of or at the direction of a Police Constable in uniform.
 - (d) a vehicle which is being used for one or more of the following purposes and which cannot reasonably be used for such a purpose without entering or being in the pedestrian zone:
 - (i) any operation involving building, demolition or excavation;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance (including winter maintenance), improvement or reconstruction of a road;
 - (iv) constructing, improving, maintaining, or cleaning of any street furniture; or
 - (v) the laying, erection, alteration, repair or cleaning of any sewer or of any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus kept or installed for the purposes of a telecommunications code system or of any other telecommunications apparatus lawfully kept installed in any position.
 - (e) a marked vehicle which, whilst used by a universal service provider in the course of the provision of a universal postal service, is required to enter or be in the pedestrian zone to enable postal packets to be delivered or collected.
 - (f) a pedal cycle.
 - (g) a vehicle being used for access to or egress from a business space or private parking place located on that part of Park Lane within the Pedestrian Zone as identified on plan B00724 PZ A-2 and where access is only available via the Pedestrian Zone.
5. The County Council, in making this Order are satisfied that this Order is required to avoid the likelihood of danger to persons using those lengths of road specified in Article 2(g) of this Order.
6. In accordance with Section 92 of the said Act of 1984 upon the coming into effect of this Order, gates may be placed at or near to the entrances to the pedestrian zone as specified in Article 2(g) of this Order.

7. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
8. The provisions of the following Orders are hereby revoked only in so far as they are affected by the restrictions imposed by this Order:

The Borough of Broxbourne (Control of Parking) (Consolidation) Order 2022

The Borough of Broxbourne (Waltham Cross Town Centre Pedestrianisation) Order 1992

The Borough of Broxbourne (Waltham Cross Town Centre Pedestrianisation) (Amendment) Order 2000
9. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any other regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act of 1984 or by or under any other enactment.



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The Hertfordshire County Council, in exercise of their powers under Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 32 and 35 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (which said act of 1984 is hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1984) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the 1984 Act, hereby makes the following Order:

PART I - PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

1. (a) This Order may be cited as “The Hertfordshire (Eleanor Cross Road, Eleanor Square, High Street and Park Lane, Waltham Cross) (Restricted Parking Zone) Order 2024” and shall come into effect on Friday 5 December 2025.
- (b) The plans numbered **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, inclusive of the keys, are incorporated into this Order, as set out in the Schedule to this Order.

Interpretation

- 2.(1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

“civil enforcement officer” has the meaning as given in the Traffic Management Act.

“County Council” means the Council of the County of Hertfordshire.

“Council” means Broxbourne Borough Council and includes any parking services contractors or authorised agent appointed by and acting on behalf of the Council for the purposes of any function under the provisions of this Order;

“designated officer” means an officer nominated by Broxbourne Borough Council to carry out Council functions associated with the provisions of this Order;

“disabled person’s badge” and “disabled person’s vehicle” have the same meaning as in the Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986 and the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Amendment Regulations 1992 and as amended by the Local Authorities Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000;

“disabled badge holders parking bay” means an area contained within the Restricted Parking Zone indicated by contrasting road surfacing or markings to show the position in which a disabled person’s vehicle may be parked as set out Article 7 and shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ P3, B00724 RPZ PA-4** and identified in the keys to those plans;

“driver” means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place, parking bay, or Restricted Parking Zone;

“enactment” means any enactment, whether public general or local, and includes any order, byelaw, rule, regulation, scheme or other instrument having effect by virtue of an enactment;

“goods” means goods of any kind whether animate or inanimate and includes postal packets of any description; and “delivering” and “collecting” in relation to any goods includes checking the goods for the purpose of their delivery or collection;

“goods vehicle” means a motor vehicle which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description and is not drawing a trailer;

‘motor vehicle’ shall have the meaning as given in Section 136(1) Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and shall include motorcycles.

“motor-cycle” has the same meaning as that in the Road Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986;

“motorcycle parking bay” means an area contained within the Restricted Parking Zone indicated by contrasting road surfacing or markings to show the position in which a motorcycle may be parked as set out Article 7 and shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and identified in the keys to those plans;

“limited waiting parking bay” means an area contained within the Restricted Parking Zone indicated by contrasting road surfacing or markings to show the position in which a motor vehicle may be parked as set out Article 7 and shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and identified in the keys to those plans;

“limited waiting motorcycle parking bay” means an area contained within the Restricted Parking Zone indicated by contrasting road surfacing or markings to show the position in which a motorcycle may be parked as set out Article 7 and shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and identified in the keys to those plans;

“owner”, in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;

“parking disc” means a disc, issued by a local authority, complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs (BS No. 4631: 1970), coloured orange or blue, and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"parking bay" means an area contained within a parking place delineated by white markings or contrasting surfacing to indicate the position in which a vehicle may be parked;

"parking place" means an area contained within the Restricted Parking Zone indicated by contrasting road surfacing or markings to show the position in which a vehicle or vehicle of a particular class may be parked as set out Articles 5 and 7 of this Order and as shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and in the keys to those plans;

“passenger vehicle” means a motor vehicle (other than a motor-cycle or invalid carriage) constructed or adapted solely for the carriage of not more than twelve passengers (exclusive of the driver) and their effects and not drawing a trailer;

"Penalty Charge" shall have the same meaning as a charge set by the Council in accordance with The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022 and the provisions of Part 6 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004;

"Penalty Charge Notice" shall mean a notice issued by a Civil Enforcement Officer in accordance with The Civil Enforcement of Road Traffic Contraventions (Approved Devices, Charging Guidelines and General Provisions) (England) Regulations 2022 and the provisions of Part 6 and Schedule 9 of the Traffic Management Act 2004.

“permitted hours” means the hours and days of the week as specified on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, and in the keys thereof;

“Restricted Parking Zone” has the same meaning as in Schedule 1 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016 and means those areas of road or sides of the road where waiting, loading or unloading is prohibited as identified as such on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, and in the keys to those plans;

“relevant position” means either:

- (i) in relation to the display of a disabled person’s badge, on the dashboard or fascia panel so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle, or where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle;
- (ii) in relation to the display of a valid permit issued under the provisions of this Order, on the dashboard or fascia of the vehicle, or where the vehicle is not fitted with a dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the front or nearside of the vehicle.

“telecommunication system” has the same meaning as in the Telecommunications Act 1984 (c.12);

“valid permit” shall have the meaning as a permit issued by the Council in a form prescribed by the Council, under the terms of The Hertfordshire (Eleanor Cross Road, Eleanor Square, High Street and Park Lane, Waltham Cross) (Pedestrian Zone) Order 2024.

- (2) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule shall, unless the context otherwise requires, be construed as a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order.
- (3) Any reference in this Order to any enactment shall be construed as a reference to that enactment as amended, applied, consolidated, re-enacted by or as having effect by virtue of any subsequent enactment.
- (4) For the purposes of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person’s badge in the relevant position when it is so regarded for the purposes of Regulation 4 of The Local Authorities’ Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

PART II - RESTRICTIONS AND PARKING PLACES

Section 1 – Provisions of the Order

3. (1) Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to stop or wait in a Restricted Parking Zone as identified on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, and in the keys to those plans.
- (2) Where a person contravenes any provision contained within this Order and any restriction or provision as shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, and the vehicle does not fall into any one of the exemptions contained within Article 4 of this Order, the owner or driver of the vehicle in question shall be deemed to have committed a contravention of this Order.
- (3) Where a person contravenes the provisions set out in Article 3(1) of this Order, the owner of the vehicle in question shall incur a penalty charge.

4. The following vehicles are exempt from the General Prohibition as set out in Article 3:

- (a) a vehicle, necessarily required for use in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (ii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction on the areas of road or sides of road; and
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the roads, lengths of road or sides of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line by a utility organisation while attending to their apparatus;
- (b) a vehicle in the service of the Council, the County Council or any other Local Authority whilst necessarily required for use in connection with highway works, highways and parking enforcement, waste collection or street cleansing activities;
- (c) a vehicle which is:
 - (i) required by law to stop; or
 - (ii) obliged to stop so as to prevent an accident; or
 - (iii) prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control; or
 - (iv) caused or permitted to stop or wait upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform.
- (d) a Public Service Vehicle whilst waiting at an authorised stopping place;
- (e) a vehicle being used for:
 - (i) fire and rescue, ambulance or police purposes; or
 - (ii) attending an emergency by a Doctor, a District Nurse or Midwife.
The Council may require evidence to show that there was a genuine emergency.
- (f) a vehicle authorised by virtue of any special written dispensation by the Council.
- (g) a vehicle in the service of a Universal Service Provider being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets, save for the areas of road and sides of the road where loading or unloading are specifically regulated as shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, and in the keys to those plans.

Designation of Parking Places

- 5. (1) Those sections of road identified on **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and in the keys to those plans, as parking places for vehicles, parking places for disabled badge holders or parking places for motorcycles are hereby authorised to be used subject to the following provisions of this Order as limited waiting parking places, disabled badge holder parking places, motorcycle parking places for such classes of vehicles in such positions and on such days and during such hours and to such limitations as identified on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and the keys to those plans.
- (2) limited waiting parking places, disabled badge holder parking places, motorcycle parking places as shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and the keys to those plans, may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of motor vehicles of the following class, that is to say, passenger vehicles (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.3 metres and the overall length of which does not exceed 5.25 metres) goods carrying vehicles (the overall height of which does not exceed 2.3 metres and the overall length of which does not exceed 5.25 metres) and motorcycles, subject to such limitations as specified within this Order and as shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and the keys to those plans.

Leaving of vehicles in Parking Places

- 6.(1) No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait in an area designated as a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place during the permitted hours unless authorised by the provisions of this Order or with the permission of a Designated Officer or Civil Enforcement Officer.
- (2) Where a person contravenes the provisions set out in Article 6(1) of this Order, the owner of the vehicle in question shall incur a penalty charge.

Vehicles for which Parking Places are designated

7. Subject to the provisions of this Order:-
 - (1) Disabled badge holder parking places as shown and identified on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4**, and the keys to those plans, may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of motor vehicles of the following class, that is to say, disabled persons vehicles (on which must be displayed in the relevant position a valid disabled persons badge and parking disc).
 - (2) Motorcycle parking places as identified and shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and the keys thereof, may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of vehicles of the following class, that is to say, motorcycles.
 - (3) Limited waiting parking places as shown and identified on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4** and the keys to those plans, as limited waiting parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of motor vehicles.
 - (4) Limited waiting motorcycle parking places as shown and identified on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4**, and the keys to those plans as limited waiting motorcycle parking places may be used for the leaving during the permitted hours of vehicles of the following class, that is to say, motorcycles.

Alteration of position of a vehicle in a Parking Place

8. Where any motor vehicle is standing in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 11 a Civil Enforcement Officer may cause to be altered the position of the motor vehicle in order that its position shall comply with those provisions.

Removal of a vehicle from a Parking Place

9. Where a Civil Enforcement Officer is of the opinion that any of the provisions contained in Articles 3 or 7 of this Order have been contravened or not complied with in respect of a motor vehicle left in any part of a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place they may remove or cause to be removed the motor vehicle from the limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place and, where it is so removed, shall provide for the safe custody of the motor vehicle and its contents.

Movement of a vehicle in a Parking Bay in an emergency

10. A Civil Enforcement Officer or Police Constable in uniform may move or cause to be moved, in case of emergency, to any place they think fit, any motor vehicle left in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place.

PART III - SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

Section 1 - General

Manner of standing in a Parking Place

11. (1) Every motor vehicle left in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Order shall so stand -
- (a) that the left or near side of the vehicle is adjacent to the left-hand edge of the carriageway and the distance between the edge of the carriageway and the near side wheels of the vehicle is not more than 300 millimetres.
 - (b) that no part of the motor vehicle obstructs any vehicular means of ingress to or egress from premises adjacent to the side of the road on which the vehicle is waiting.

Power to suspend the use of a Parking Place

12. (1) Any person duly authorised by the Council may suspend the use of a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place or any part thereof whenever they consider such suspension reasonably necessary:
- (a) for the purpose of facilitating the movement of traffic or promoting its safety;
 - (b) for the purpose of any building operation, demolition or excavation adjacent to the parking place, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the highway or the cleansing of gullies in or adjacent to the parking place, the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or adjacent to the parking place of any sewer or of any main, pipe, or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telecommunication system or the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign;
 - (c) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place on any occasion of the removal of furniture to or from one office or dwelling-house adjacent to the parking place from or to a depository, another office or dwelling-house;
 - (d) on any occasion on which it is likely by reason of some special attraction that any street will be thronged or obstructed; or
 - (e) for the convenience of occupiers of premises adjacent to the parking place, at times of weddings or funerals, or on other special occasions.
- (2) Any person suspending the use of a parking place or any part thereof in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article shall thereupon place or cause to be placed in or adjacent to that parking place or part thereof a traffic sign indicating that waiting by motor vehicles is prohibited.
- (3) No person shall cause or permit a motor vehicle to wait in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place or any part thereof during which such period as there is in or adjacent to that limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place or part thereof a traffic

sign placed in pursuance of paragraph (2) above provided that nothing in this paragraph shall apply -

- (a) in respect to any motor vehicle being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police purposes or any vehicle which is waiting for any reason specified in Article 12(1)(b), (d) or (e); or
- (b) to anything done with permission of the person suspending the use of the parking place or part thereof in pursuance of paragraph (1) of this Article.

Restriction on the use of a Parking Place

13. During the permitted hours no person shall use a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place or any motor vehicle while it is in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place in connection with the sale or offering or exposing for sale of any goods to any person in or near the limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for sale of their skill in handicraft or their services in any other capacity:

Provided that nothing in this Article shall prevent the sale of goods from a motor vehicle -

- (a) if the vehicle is a passenger vehicle, a goods carrying vehicle, a motor-cycle or an invalid carriage and the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected; or
- (b) if the vehicle is one to which the provisions of Article 14(1)(h) apply.

Restriction on waiting by a vehicle in a Parking Place

- 14.(1) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, any motor vehicle may wait during the permitted hours in any part of a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place if the use of that part has not been suspended and if:

- (a) the motor vehicle is waiting for so long as may be necessary for the purpose of enabling any person to board or alight from the motor vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom their personal luggage, provided that the motor vehicle is within the marked limits of a parking bay;
- (b) the motor vehicle is waiting owing to the driver being prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond their control or to such waiting being necessary in order to avoid an accident;
- (c) the motor vehicle is being used for fire and rescue, ambulance or police purposes, or not being a passenger vehicle, is being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or in the performance of such duties for the motor vehicle to wait in the place in which it is waiting;
- (d) the motor vehicle is waiting for so long as may be necessary to enable it to be used in connection with the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (e) the motor vehicle is waiting -
 - (i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the parking place are being unloaded from the motor vehicle or, having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered; or

- (ii) while postal packets are being collected for the loading on the motor vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the parking place in which the motor vehicle is waiting or, having been so collected, are being unloaded thereon;
 - (f) the motor vehicle not being a passenger vehicle is waiting only for as long as may be reasonably necessary to enable it to be used for the purpose specified in Article 12(1)(b);
 - (g) the motor vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture to or from one office to a dwelling-house adjacent to the parking bay from or to a depository, another office or dwelling-house;
 - (h) in any other case the motor vehicle is waiting within the marked limits of a parking bay for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading the vehicle at premises adjacent to the parking place in which the vehicle is waiting and the vehicle does not wait for a period exceeding twenty minutes or the period during which the vehicle is exempt from payment of the initial charge by virtue of Article 19(a) whichever is the longer or for such longer period as a Police Constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer may approve;
- (2) Except as provided by this Order, the driver or person in charge of a motor vehicle shall not cause or permit a vehicle to wait in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place during the permitted hours.

Placing of traffic signs, etc.

15. The County Council shall:

- (a) place and maintain traffic signs indicating the limits of each limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place;
- (b) place and maintain in or in the vicinity of each limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place traffic signs of a design approved by the Secretary of State for the Department for Transport indicating that the parking place may be used during the permitted hours for the leaving only of the vehicles specified in Articles 6 and 7; and
- (c) carry out such other work as is reasonably required for the purposes of the satisfactory operation of a parking place.

Section 2 – Penalty Charge Notices

Penalty Charge Notices

16 (1) Where a person contravenes any of the provisions of this Order, or restrictions specified therein as shown on plans **B00724 RPZ PA1, B00724 RPZ PA2, B00724 RPZ PA3, B00724 RPZ PA4 and B00724 RPZ Mod**, and the keys to those plans, the owner of the motor vehicle in question shall incur a penalty charge.

- (2) That charge shall be payable to Broxbourne Borough Council in accordance with the instructions contained on the Penalty Charge Notice.

Period for which a vehicle may be left after a Penalty Charge has been incurred

17 The period for which a motor vehicle may be left in a limited waiting parking place, a disabled badge holder parking place or a motorcycle parking place during permitted hours after a penalty charge has been incurred shall not exceed one hour.

Restriction on the removal of Penalty Charge notices

18 (1) Where a penalty charge notice has been issued in accordance with the provisions of Article 16 and attached to a motor vehicle no person not being the driver of the motor vehicle shall remove the notice from the motor vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of that motor vehicle.

(2) Provided that nothing herein shall apply to a Civil Enforcement Officer or Police Constable in uniform or person removing the motor vehicle in pursuance of an arrangement made by the police constable in uniform or under the regulations in pursuance of powers contained in Sections 99,100, 101 and 102 of the Act of 1984.



 - (e) for fire and rescue service, police or ambulance purposes.
 - (f) in the service of the local authority or statutory water undertaker or water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
6. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.



