ENFORCEMENT NOTICE

OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Issued by: Broxbourne Borough Council ("the Council")

1. **THIS IS A FORMAL NOTICE** which is issued by the Council because it appears to it that there has been a breach of planning control, under Section 171A(1)(a) of the above Act, at the land described below. It considers that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

28 Franklin Avenue, Cheshunt, Hertfordshire, EN7 5DX shown edged red on the attached plan.

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, erection of part two storey, part single storey rear extension and roof extension with increased roof height and rear dormer.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

- 4.1 It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred in the last 4 years.
- 4.2 The unauthorised development by reason of its height, excessive massing and bulk is unsympathetically related to the parent building and is out of character with the wider area. This results in a structure which is overbearing on a neighbouring dwelling and is detrimentally intrusive onto the amenity of neighbouring occupiers. As a result, the development detrimentally affects the outlook and visual amenity of neighbouring properties and the character of the wider area. The development is consequently contrary to the aims and objectives and provisions of Policies H6, H8, HD13, HD14 or HD16 of the Borough of Broxbourne Local Plan Second Review 2001-2011 (December 2005), Policies DSC1, DSC2 and EQ1 of the emerging draft Local Plan 2018-2033, and the Council's Supplementary Planning Guidance (August 2004, updated 2013), and policies contained in the National Planning Policy Framework.
- 4.3 The development, in particular the two storey element of the rear extension including parapet wall, by reason of the height, depth, bulk and proximity to the boundary with No 26 Franklin Avenue, results in an un-neighbourly addition that is overbearing and results in overshadowing, loss of light to the neighbouring property and is detrimental to visual amenity of neighbouring occupiers. As such the development does not comply with Policies H6, HD14, HD16 of the Borough of Broxbourne Local Plan Second Review 2001-2011 (December 2005), Policies DSC1, DSC2 and EQ1 of the emerging draft Local Plan 2018-2033, and the Council's Supplementary Planning Guidance (August 2004, updated 2013)), and policies contained in the National Planning Policy Framework.

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

- (i) Revert the property to its pre-development condition by taking the following steps:
 - a) Remove the roof extension with increased roof height and rear dormer in its entirety; and
 - Bring the roof of the property to its original height so that no part of the finished roof exceeds the height of adjoining property at no 26 Franklin Avenue, Cheshunt, Hertfordshire, EN7 5DX; and
 - c) Remove part two storey and part single storey rear extension in its entirety; and
 - d) Reinstate rear elevation in its original position so that no part of the rear wall protrudes beyond the rear wall of adjoining property at no 26 Franklin Avenue, Cheshunt, Hertfordshire, EN7 5DX. Or

- (ii) Remove the unauthorised development and alter the property so that it complies with the approved plans attached to prior approval ref. 07/16/0447/PN42 and planning permission ref. 07/16/0546/HF by taking following steps:
 - a) Remove the roof extension with increased roof height and rear dormer in its entirety; and
 - Bring the roof of the property to its original height so that no part of the finished roof exceeds the height of adjoining property at no 26 Franklin Avenue, Cheshunt, Hertfordshire, EN7 5DX; and
 - c) Alter the part two storey and part single storey rear extension in accordance with the approved plans attached to prior approval ref. 07/16/0447/PN42 and planning permission ref. 07/16/0546/HF; and
- (iii) Clear all rubbish and debris to approved place of disposal in connection with compliance with point (i) or (ii).

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

6 months after this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This Notice takes effect on **24th August 2018** unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

IF YOU APPEAL

- When giving notice of appeal OR
- Within 14 days from the date that The Planning Inspectorate sends you a notice that requires you to send a statement

If you wish to have your appeal also considered as an express application for planning permission, or you intend to make an appeal under Ground (a), you may be required to pay a fee.

A fee may be payable for the express application for planning permission for the development alleged to be in breach of planning control in the enforcement notice. This is pursuant to regulation 10 of the Town and Country Planning (Fees for Applications and Deemed Applications) Regulations 1989 (7).

The fee for this case is £412.00. This amount is payable to the Council.

Failure to comply with an enforcement notice, that has taken effect, can result in prosecution and/or direct action by the Council.
