RECOMMENDED that:

The Council has received a Street Naming request for 2 new roads at Land at the Junction of Newgatestreet Road & St James Road Goffs Oak

It is proposed that the new roads will be called Godfrey Crecent and Evergreen Gardens and the flat name will be Monarchs Oak House.

Monarch Oak House was chosen in reference to the oak planted by Sir Theodore Godfrey that Goffs Oak derives its name from- Godfrey's relationship to William the Conqueror ties in with the themes of monarchy and royalty as well. Evergreen Gardens ties in to the language of plants and nature surrounding the famous oak (e.g. acorn, leaf, wood, flower), and is apt for a street that will have plenty of soft landscaping and planting such as trees, shrubs, herbaceous plants, hedges, etc.
