# Kerbside recycling box with net for loose cans and plastic

No plastic bags. Tins, cans, plastic bottles, pots, tubs and trays should all be rinsed clean and empty of food and liquid. Large plastic bottles should be squashed flat. Please be sure to use the net to help contain your recyclables.

No plastic bags, bubble wrap or polystyrene. Large cardboard packaging such as TV/furniture boxes should be broken down, and placed under or alongside the kerbside box for collection.



# Council kerbside bin for food waste

Weekly food waste collection. You can use ANY soft plastic bag (except black sacks) or line the bin with newspaper.



#### Council black wheeled 180 litre bin for nonrecyclable waste

Non-recyclable household waste only.

Bin lid must be closed.

Extra non-recyclable waste on top of your bin or next to your bin will not be collected.



#### Council green wheeled bin for the opt-in chargeable green waste collection service



### **Missed kerbside collection**

Missed collections must be reported online at www.broxbourne.gov.uk/waste/report-missed-bin or by contacting the Council on 01992 785555 once the collection team has left your road. Bins and boxes should be left at the property boundary, or designated collection point, ready for collection. The Council will return to pick it up within two working days of receiving the report. Missed collections must be reported before midnight on the day following the scheduled collection.

Reporting a missed bin later than this will mean it cannot be collected until the next scheduled visit.
