RESTORATION OF FORMER BALLAST PIT
CHURCH LANE, WORMLEY

Thank you for your letter of 7th June 1983¹

One of my assistants met Mr Edwards at the site on the afternoon of the 6th, and was able to reassure him that albeit belatedly, the infilling works were progressing satisfactorily and in accordance with the guidelines laid down by HCC representatives on their regular visits to the site.

... As requested, I enclose a plan of the site showing the area yet to be filled. This will require a maximum of 2 metres of compacted fill graded out to original levels at the edge of the site.

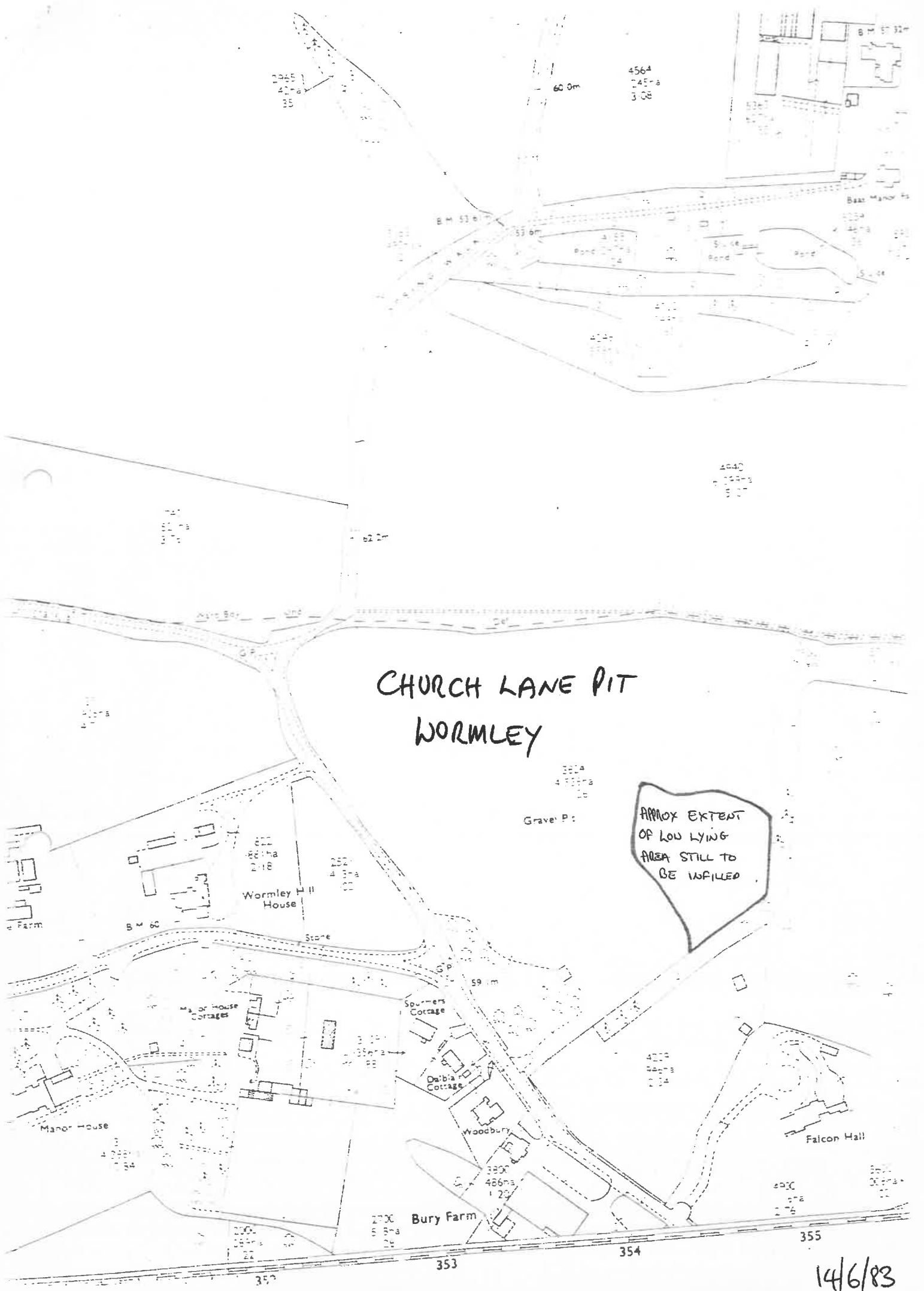
Whilst infilling with waste materials continues, your client should make every effort to obtain sufficient clean soil to comply with the requirements of Paragraph 18 of the Site Licence and Condition 5 of the planning permission. These requirements are that the penultimate layer of cover over the waste should "to a depth of not less than 1 metre, be kept free of materials likely to interfere with the final restoration or subsequent cultivation" And the final layer be "composed of soil or soil-forming material at least 300 mm deep, which is readily capable of promoting plant growth."

One other matter I would appreciate clarification on is whether your client has decided to apply for the permanent diversion of the footpath that otherwise should be reinstated across the site, once restoration is completed.
